
ARTICLE 157
Redevelopment Authority

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Redevelopment Authority of the City of Franklin was established under the provisions of the "Urban Redevelopment Law" of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, being the Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania approved May 24, 1945, P.L. 991, and the amendments and supplements thereto, and by Ordinance No. 1 of 1962 of the City of Franklin. The Authority is to redevelop areas which have become blighted because of the unsafe, unsanitary, inadequate or over-crowded condition of the dwellings therein, and/or because of inadequate planning of the areas, and/or excess land coverage by the buildings thereon, and/or because of the defective design and arrangement of the buildings thereon, and/or faulty street or lot layout, economically or socially undesirable land uses.
